What we can offer:

We offer advice and advocacy services on a wide range of issues including:

- Asylum support applications (particularly help with section 4 and section 98)
- Assistance with inappropriate or poor housing conditions
- Food parcels (call our office before 12 for collection at 2pm on Wednesdays)
- Refugee Survival Trust (RST) destitution grants
- RST grants for travel to Liverpool
- General issues regarding asylum support (eg resolving problems with ASPEN card)
- Our caseworkers have a wide range of knowledge of local services and will signpost on to other agencies where appropriate

Who is it for:

Our doors are open to all, however, our service is primarily for those in the asylum process. We will always meet with anyone who comes to our drop-in and refer people to other services as appropriate.

How to refer:

No referral is required. Providing they come in the allocated drop-in times, anyone can attend our service. However, if your client requires an interpreter please let us know.

When to refer:

You can refer clients to our service at any time in their asylum process. For section 4 applications in particular, please refer if your client:

- Has a further submissions appointment in Liverpool and has not yet travelled
- Is Libyan without further submissions
- Has physical or mental health issues which may prevent them from travelling
- Is submitting a judicial review
- Is involved in the assisted voluntary return scheme
