Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 31 March 2019

The trustees who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006, present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2019. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

The company's objects are to promote equality and integration within and between the diverse communities of the Greater Govan area, and to involve local people and organisations in taking positive action on poverty, discrimination and other life stresses with a focus on education, health, welfare and social inclusion for refugee, minority ethnic and migrant communities.

- To co-ordinate the running of local services for asylum seeker, refugee, BME and migrant communities
- To promote a positive understanding of the issues facing asylum seeker, refugee, BME and migrant communities in the wider community
- To provide opportunities for cross cultural contact for all communities living in the area
- To involve residents of all communities in its work
- To provide a forum for the sharing of information, skills and good practice
- To provide a forum where issues of common concern can be raised
- To seek to influence policy and service planning partnerships at a local and city wide level
- To carry on any other activities which further any of the above objects
- To promote companies whose activities may further one or more of the above objects, or may generate income to support the activities of the company, acquire and hold shares in such companies and carry out, in relation to any such company which is a subsidiary of the company, all such functions as may be associated with a holding company

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable Activities

GCP has continued to grow to better serve its community. Over the past year, we have grown to a staff base of 13, and had continued financial growth in order to facilitate this. This has allowed us to increase our service provision, including two extra weekly ESOL classes, and an advocacy outreach in the Greater Pollok area, amongst other improvements.

We co-produced a strategic plan which was launched on the 5th of February 2019. This was co-produced between community members, volunteers, staff and directors. Our community members identified various goals for the organisation, such as developing a mentoring and befriending programme for refugees and asylum claimants, providing information sessions on the asylum process for new claimants, and to provide more opportunities for community members to relax and socialise. The Strategy Group will continue to meet in order to evaluate the Strategic Plan's progress and hold GCP to account.

We have been nominated and shortlisted for the Organisation of the Year at the Scottish Diversity Awards.

We have distributed over 1800 food parcels over the last 12 months through our food distribution service.

Our ESOL class in our community flat hosts an average of 28 people a week to help supplement statutory provision.

Our Participatory Action Research project has produced an education pack to go alongside the film, which will be used in schools, GP practices, and with other organisations to inform as many people as possible of the difficulties of the asylum process.

Perhaps the biggest area of growth over the past year has been in our advice and advocacy services. We specialise in advising asylum claimants, and alleviating destitution. We have 5 members of staff on this project, and have held over 1800 advice sessions throughout the year. We have been recognised as one of the key organisations in Glasgow to deliver advocacy services, and resulted in us playing a key part in Glasgow City Council's taskforce on asylum seekers. We continue to be one of the most efficient organisations in Scotland in helping asylum claimants access accommodation and financial support.

Our Homework Club continues to exist to help children and their parents understand and engage with the Scottish education curriculum. Over a thousand children have attended our homework club over the year, and has been used as an example of good practice throughout Glasgow, with institutions like Ibrox Primary School copying our model of success.

We have over 40 active volunteers who help support our services.

Our social enterprise Voiceover has a projected end of year turnover of £170.5k.

We have had some success in generating new VoiceOver clients in Glasgow and have extended our services to Edinburgh.

We have started informal social evenings for our interpreters with training talks included and are also now able through LifeLink to offer counselling to any interpreter who, during the course of their business, experiences issues which require support.

We are also pleased that our board demonstrates diversity. In the last year we have reached the aim of 1/3rd of our directors being community members. Also, as per a recent survey by the Coalition for Racial Equality and Rights we have a higher representation of BME trustees than many other charities. (CRER 2019, Charity Trustee Ethnicity in Glasgow)

Reserves policy

In line with OSCR recommendations we progress toward building a three-month reserve of unrestricted funds. This allows us to respond to emergencies and would allow a period of planned run down of activity in the event of total withdrawal of major funding.

Based on the accounts for the year ended 31 March 2019, ordinary expenditure for three months amounts to £119,110. At balance date the charity held unrestricted reserves of £95,776. Therefore the trustees are not satisfied that this policy is being met and aim to build unrestricted reserves through income generation.

Results

The charity incurred a net deficit of £4,852 for the year ended 31 March 2019 (2018: surplus £100,738). At 31 March 2019, the reserves totalled £126,366 (2018: £131,218) and of these, £95,776 were unrestricted (2017: £94,877).

The significant variance in surplus/deficit compared with last year was primarily due to the charity utilising grant funding of circa £70k received in the latter part of 2017-18.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governance and Trustees

Govan and Craigton Integration Network changed its name to Govan Community Project. on 20th December 2016. It is incorporated as a company limited by guarantee and is a registered Scottish Charity.

The company is governed by the terms of its Memorandum and Articles of Association.

Govan and Craigton Integration Network (now Govan Community Project) was incorporated as a company on 22 December 2010 and is limited by guarantee. It has been recognised as a Scottish Charity by the Office of the Scottish Charity Regulator (OSCR).

Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

During the year any member may submit an application to the board to become a director. This application will be discussed at the next board meeting and if found to be appropriate the applicant will be invited to attend a board meeting. The board will then vote whether to appoint the member or not.

At the Annual General Meeting members may elect any member providing he or she is willing to be a director. We plan to submit a change to our articles regarding this to bring the application process into line with the application process throughout the year.

In order to ensure a diverse pool of talent for the future board succession and taking into account the need for board rotation given the length of tenure of the existing trustees, GCP will shortly undertake external advertising for non-executive trustee roles. It is hoped that this will attract an appropriate pool from which the requisite skills and experience can be selected for these voluntary trustee roles. Role specifications are currently being developed for the office holder posts in order to determine an objective criteria for such appointments

Organisational structure

Govan Community Project (GCP) is managed by a full time Project Manager. It employs a part time Development Worker and a part time Groups Coordinator. The Project manager directs all staff in the activities provided by GCP, and attends board meetings to make reports on progress and opportunities, but has no voting rights on matter of policy and company direction. GCP also employs two sessional staff to run specific activities. VoiceOver, the social enterprise which supports our work, employs a full time project manager, and a part time administrator. Lastly, the organisation works with approximately 35 volunteers.

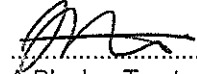

**Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of

I report on the accounts for the year ended 31 March 2019 set out on pages eight to twenty two.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

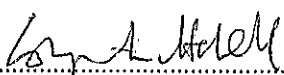

Notes to the Financial Statements for the Year Ended 31 March 2019

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland', the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005, the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended) and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Tangible fixed assets

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost less residual value of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows:

Fixtures, fittings and equipment - 6 years straight line

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

Pension costs and other post-retirement benefits

The charitable company operates a defined contribution pension scheme. Contributions payable to the charitable company's pension scheme are charged to the Statement of Financial Activities in the period to which they relate.

18. PURPOSES OF UNRESTRICTED FUNDS

General Funds - The unrestricted, 'free reserves' of the Charity.

Designated - Fixed Assets - Represents the net book value of the Charity's tangible fixed assets. Depreciation is charged to the fund and additions are transferred to it.

VoiceOver Interpreting - A small social enterprise currently operating as part of the organisation. Any surpluses will be used in furtherance of the charity's community work

Robertson Trust - Core funding to support salaries and core running costs of the charity.

William Grant Foundation - Core funding to support salaries and core running costs of the charity.

Tudor Trust - Core funding to support salaries and core running costs of the charity.

AB Charitable Trust - funding towards core costs.

19. PURPOSES OF RESTRICTED FUNDS

Refugee Survival Trust Destitution Fund - Donations received for destitute individuals.

Glasgow City Council Integrated Grants Fund - Funding received under a consortium arrangement which was distributed to Integration Networks in the South of the city; to contribute towards core costs of the organisation

Equalities Fund - This funding allows us to provide staff and facilities for our Women's Group, Men's Group and Homework Club

NHS Health Improvement - Funding provided to support our Participatory Action Research project. It was predominately used to fund a media project in collaboration with Plantation Productions.

Foundation Scotland - This was used to fund a series of trips for GCP's Women's Group, and other associated costs: e.g. a playworker.

BBC Children in Need - Funds towards supporting and expanding our Homework Club.

Cycling UK - Funds to support our moss heights gala day event.

Big Lottery Awards for All - To support our participatory action research project with staffing costs and volunteer expenses.

Big Lottery Community Led Activity - To fund our asylum support caseworker and overheads, including office rent and management fees.

Co-op Local Community Fund - To purchase items for our community flat

Community Jobs Scotland - To fund our administrative assistant for VoiceOver

Glasgow Guarantee - Funded 50% of the post for our administrative assistant and then acting manager, for VoiceOver.

Minority Ethnic Advocacy Project- BME advocacy project in partnership with WSREC
